

GENERAL INFORMATION

First, we would like to thank you for considering Island Point Lodge for a fishing trip to Alaska. Island Point Lodge can offer you a complete salmon, rock fish, trout and halibut fishing trip. Airline reservations can be made through VIKING TRAVEL in Petersburg Alaska 1-800-327-2571.

The following will provide you with more details of what to expect at Island Point Lodge. We will explain what is provided at the lodge, and what is expected of you when you select our lodge for your Alaskan salmon, trout and halibut fishing experience.

Please remember! Island Point Lodge will provide you with comfortable accommodations for a reasonable cost. It is important to understand that this is called a “fishing trip”, not a “catching trip”. There will be times when large schools of fish will arrive creating a fishing frenzy. At other times it will be fishing as usual – you will have to work at it.

A FISHING TRIP THAT FITS YOUR BUDGET!

The length of the trip is approximately 9 days, portal to portal (reference the day schedule sheet for details). The trip includes 7 days and 6 nights at the lodge, and one day each way for air travel. Arrival day is **Saturday** and departure day is the following **Friday morning**.

Air transportation is by jet aircraft to Petersburg. Island Point lodge personnel will meet you at the airport and transport you by van and boat to the lodge.

Tourism is very popular during the summer months in Alaska. Early reservations for Alaska Air will offer better air fare pricing as well as seat assignments. October is a good time to make reservations. Using the Alaska Airlines credit card with its \$99.00 Companion Ticket can be a great savings on your air travel costs.

This is a self guided fishing trip. Our lodge personnel will provide you with maps and information on where to fish for salmon, halibut and trout. United States Coast Guard requires anyone guiding on salt water to have a commercial six pack license. This requires a special two week course and extensive testing and qualifications to obtain the license. You should have some experience with the operation of an outboard motor boat, be familiar with navigation rules, and be able to read nautical maps.

We do offer **rentals of GPS's and depth/fish finders**. The fee for each of these will be **\$25.00 per week**. You may bring your own portable fish finders and GPS'S.

Regarding what you need to bring, reference the luggage information sheet (page 6). The luggage information sheet recommends what you will need to make your trip comfortable. Take our advice, it will make your trip easier.

You do not have to bring coolers. Airline charges make it cost effective to purchase fish boxes at a cost of \$25.00/box at the lodge.

PORTAL TO PORTAL

Petersburg is in the southern panhandle section of Alaska. This area of Alaska is known as the Inside Passage and consists of thousands of islands. The weather is generally warm, but the water is cold. Light rain and drizzle can be expected, so rain gear is a must. Generally we will wear the rain jacket every day as it acts as a wind breaker while we are traveling about in the boats. The temperatures range from the fifties at night to the seventies during the day. Daylight normally occurs between 3 to 4 o'clock in the morning in June and darkens about 10 to 11 o'clock in the evening. June 21st is the longest day. We lose approximately five minutes of daylight each day thereafter.

The total length of the trip including travel time, will be approximately nine days. Arrival day at the lodge is a **Saturday** and departure day is the following **Friday morning** totaling a stay of 6 nights and 7 days. Friday is a transitional day, which is used to prepare the rooms for the newly arriving guests. **Please co-operate with us and make your reservations insuring that you will arrive on Saturday morning and depart on the following Friday morning.** The trip is generally broken down as follows:

Day 1 **Departure to Seattle.** Overnight stay in Seattle. Suggested motel for an overnight stay in Seattle or Petersburg.. Reference page 5 Hotel information. You will be required to pick up your luggage and take it to the hotel with you or in Seattle you may store it overnight at the airport for a charge per cooler/bag (reference page 10 for details). Upon retrieving your luggage, use the hotel courtesy phone. State that you are a guest and request a van for transport to the hotel.. Bring all the necessary items for the overnight stay in Seattle in your carry-on luggage.

SATURDAY

Day 2 If you are in Seattle there will be an early morning flight via Alaska Airlines to Petersburg, Alaska. Island Point Lodge personnel will meet you at the airport and transport you and your luggage to the lodge. We will stop in town so that you may purchase special items before going to the lodge. You will arrive at the lodge in the early afternoon and you will be able to do some fishing in the afternoon. **RECOMMENDED** - stay in Petersburg Friday evening (Hotels page 5), we will pick you up at the hotel around 8:30 in the morning and transport you to the lodge early for an orientation and get you out fishing.

Day 3-8 Fishing - Salmon, Halibut, rock fish and Trout. You will have a ½ day fishing on Saturday and five full days of fishing Sunday thru Thursday.

FRIDAY

Day 8-9 The suggested departure is on the morning flight leaving Petersburg. Delays in afternoon departures due to weather or other problems could cause you to miss your evening connections in Seattle. Be prepared to leave the Lodge Friday morning at 7:30 for the airport. There will be some time to shop in Petersburg for gifts before the departure.

INFORMATION ON ALASKA AIRLINES

Alaska Air is the only commercial passenger carrier landing at the Petersburg Airport, with only two stops per day. It offers special rates with a limited number of seats available on a specific flight. These are available on a first come, first served basis.

For example, an Air Alaska Flight leaving Seattle with stops in Ketchikan, Wrangle, and Petersburg may fly a split flight of cargo and passengers. The front of the aircraft will be loaded with cargo containers. The rear of the plane will have 72 passenger seats available. Non cargo flight are getting more prevalent and they carry more passengers.

Alaska Airlines will offer the first 20 seat reservations at a discounted rate. The next 20 will be at a higher rate and the remainder will be a standard rate.

As you can see, the earlier you make and pay for your reservations, the better opportunity you will have for obtaining a lower rate. However, it is possible that a lower rate may be come available due to competition or other circumstances. Re-booking for a fee is possible. During September and October, Alaska Airline usually offer a discounted rate.

It is best to reserve early to ensure flight availability and a good rate.

THE LODGE

FACILITIES

Island Point Lodge is located on Kupreanof Island, opposite Mitkof Island, Approximately 12 miles south of the town of Petersburg. The island has no roads or utilities. Power is supplied by diesel generators and power is on 24 hours a day.

There are seven cabins with bunk style accommodations sleeping 6, 4 people each and two couples cabins with double beds and a single bunk accommodation. Each of the cabins has its own bathroom with showers. The 2nd floor of the main lodge has three rooms accommodating 6, 4, and 2 guests respectively. These rooms share three bathrooms with showers, which are located in the rear of the main lodge. There is a ½ bath on the second floor which is handy for night use.

Fresh drinking water is available at all times from a dispenser located in the eating area of the lodge and in the coffee area sink faucet marked "purified water".

MEALS

Breakfast from 5 AM until 8AM daily. Lunch is usually sandwiches which the guests make themselves. Dinner is served at 7 PM. There are several other lunch and snack options during the day located in the coffee area. If you have a special dietary need, please speak to the cook. We will do our best to help you with your request. The Lodge will provide the following beverages - coffee, tea, milk, tang, and lemonade. We do not provide canned soft drinks or alcoholic beverages. You can purchase some beer, bottle water and wine at the lodge.

BOATS

A boat, and the appropriate equipment will be assigned to you and your party. The operator must have some experience in operating boats with outboard motors. Boats are equipped with safety vests, ropes anchors, oars, pail, bait containers, and lunch coolers. A limited amount of bait is available. Guests are invited to catch fresh bait by jigging for herring. Commercially processed herring is available for \$5.00 per PKG.

Everyone must sign the boat use agreement and indemnity form as well as the reservation form and send them to our office. A credit card imprint will be required upon your arrival at the lodge for boat usage. A pre-inspection of the boat will be done with you at the dock. Those assigned to the boat will be responsible for any damage or loss of equipment.

CRAB and SHRIMP TRAPS

Due to the loss of so many crab traps in the past few years we are now requiring a \$100.00 deposit (cash or credit card) for the use a crab trap. When the trap is returned to us, the deposit will be returned.

GPS'S AND FISH/DEPTH FINDER UNIT RENTAL - HARD TOP COVERED BOAT RENTAL – FISH BOXES PRICES

Island Point Lodge can offer you a rental of a GPS/fish-depth finder (\$50.00/week) or a fish-dept finder (\$25.00/week)

Hard top covered boats may be available at an extra cost of \$530.00 per boat, per week, includes tax. Comes with a larger motor, 90 hp, GPS /Fish and Depth Finder and a two way marine radio. 18 foot boat will hold two fishermen comfortably and possibly a third.

Airline Fish Boxes Fish boxes are available at the lodge at the cost of \$25.00 per box.

LUGGAGE INFORMATION

Due to the luggage restrictions being implemented by the airlines we recommend that you travel with the minimum amount of luggage. It appears that the airlines have several different rates for luggage charges.

Bring minimal clothing, something you can wash or throw away. The lodge has coin operated washers and dryers. \$2.00 per wash, soap is available, \$2.00 per load for dryer. Bring some quarter or they are available from the kitchen.

Spinning, trolling and Halibut rods and reels are available at the lodge at no cost.

If you and/or several people in your group decide to bring your own rods the airline may charge you the cost of a piece of luggage. Combine rods into one case to save room. If several members of the group have rod holders, duct tape them together to make one piece of luggage.

You can mail (US Postal Service) boxes and rods holders to the lodge and vise versa. It can take up to 2 weeks. Check with your local post office.

We do not recommend coolers because of the shipping cost. We do have available insulated airline shipping boxes. The cost per box is \$25.00.

TWO HAND CARRY PIECES ON THE PLANE airline regulation size for storage under the seat or in the above compartment. Regulations do not allow you to carry knives or guns on the plane. Leave them in your other luggage.

Your hand carry bag should contain the necessary clothes and items for the overnight stay in Seattle on your way to Alaska.

Please have your name, address and telephone number on all luggage!

The new airline regulations regarding luggage have become much stricter since 9/11. The airlines want to charge for everything. Check with your travel agent or airline for information regarding luggage, weights and charges.

CLOTHING AND SUPPLIES

The following is a list of suggested items that you will need while on this fishing trip. Please do not overload your luggage with items that are not necessary.

OPTIONAL - ONE ROD CASE

Boat rod 5 or 6 foot stiff action, Light salt water rod 7 to 8 foot (two pieces) medium action and trout rods. Line weight see page 8.

The lodge does provide spinning rods and reels as well as halibut rods and reels. The lodge does not supply fly rods and reels. You must bring your own if you want to use a fly rod.

NOTE: Effective January 1, 2011, felt-soles will be prohibited from use in the Fresh waters of Southeast Alaska. Although not documented in Alaska, traveling anglers, felt soles, have been found to transmit fish parasites and diseases.

A COIN OPERATED WASHER AND DRYER IS AVAILABLE AT THE LODGE

This will help to keep your clothing requirements to a minimum. Cost \$2.00/load.

OPTIONAL SHOULD YOU DECIDE TO USE YOUR OWN ROD AND/OR REEL

Salmon rod, a 7 or 8 foot (stiff rod for setting hook), line weight 25 lb. (reference fishing equipment). Island Point Lodge can provide you with a spinning, trolling or Halibut rod with proper gear. Refer to page 8 "FISHING EQUIPMENT" for fish weight to determine reel and line sizing.

CAMCORDERS are a great way to record the excitement of your trip. Take a couple of cassettes or chips. Video tapes/DVD's relive your fishing trip for you and your friends. Power is available for recharging batteries.

PORTABLE DEPTH/FISH FINDER or GPS You are welcome to bring your own.

FISHING EQUIPMENT

See the CLOTHING AND SUPPLIES list for rods (page 6).

Island Point Lodge provides for the use of spinning rods and reels and halibut rods and reels if you choose not to bring your own.

Hooks, weights, halibut spreaders and lures can be purchased at the lodge. The lodge will buy back any equipment not damaged except for used lures and hooks. Lures in packages, unused, will be accepted. A limited amount of bait (**if available**) will be supplied daily. Processed trolling herring is available for \$5.00 per package. We may also provide processed fresh herring when it is **available**. Please take proper care of the bait since it may sometimes be in short supply. All bait should be kept in the covered containers provided with each boat. Please return you bait each evening so that it can be checked before being refrozen and used again.

We do not supply fly fishing equipment. Imitation salmon eggs are most attractive for salmon, arctic char, and cutthroat trout. Red, pink, orange, and chartreuse are popular colors. You can clean and package your own fish, or our lodge personnel will clean and at your request, package the fish for you. The fish will be stored in a chest freezer and then taken across the channel to be stored in a -30 degree walk-in freezer.

Lures can be purchased at the lodge.

The rods and reels that you will need for salmon fishing will depend on the salmon and style of fishing that you will do.

King Salmon (Chinook) will average 20-35 pounds. A 40 pound king is not unusual, and occasionally, a lunker in the 50 pound range is caught. Casting, trolling and mooching are the methods used. Line test is 30lb. Fly fishing is productive especially with egg patterns.

Red Salmon (Sockeye) are smaller, averaging 4-10 pounds, and are caught by casting and fly fishing. Line test is 4-10lbs.

Pink Salmon (Humpies) are the smallest of the salmon family, averaging 2-5 pounds, and are caught by casting and fly fishing. Line test is 4-10 lb.

Chum Salmon (Dog) average 6-12 pounds and are caught by casting. Line test is 8-15lb.

Silver Salmon (Coho) average 8-15 pounds, and are caught by trolling and casting. Line test 8-12lbs. Excellent fly fishing.

Halibut and Rock fishing will require a boat rod and a suitable reel. Line test is 80-100lbs. If you do not have a suitable rod, the lodge will have them available. You will be need to purchase a halibut package containing two spreader bar, two weights, two halibut hooks. (SEE BELOW)

GPS's and Fish/Depth finders are available at the lodge for rent or bring your own.

HALIBUT AND SALMON WEIGHT AND HOOK/LEADER PACKAGES ARE AVAILABLE ON A CASH BASIS. COST OF A HALIBUT KIT IS \$45.00 AND THE SALMON KIT IS \$15.00. At the end of your fishing trip Island Point Lodge will buy back any of the above items with the exception of the used hooks.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

Fish Cleaning and Packaging

We will clean and fillet all your fish and will package your catch for freezing and shipping.

We have a -30 degrees walk in freezer on Mitkof Island, to freeze your catch.

We suggest using zip lock gallon freezer bags for Dungeness Crab and to package your fish in small quantities. Cellophane will be used to wrap your fish before using freezer wrap and then package several small packages into zip lock bags. We will mark your wrapped fish and bags with a number provided for you at the lodge, and type of fish, S for Salmon, H for Halibut, before putting them in the holding freezer.

We do have waxed insulated cardboard airline boxes available at a cost of \$25.00 per box.

Gratuities

Several of our clients have made inquiries regarding standard procedures for gratuities. Gratuity amounts are entirely up to the individual. This should be determined by your satisfaction of the staff's services rendered to you, much the same as your expectations when you dine out. Please consider what each member of the Island Point Lodge staff provides for you on a daily basis. The lodge cook and lodge personnel appreciate your generosity and they generally receive a tip between \$200 to \$250 collectively from each guest. Remember, these employees have been of service to you for the entire week. Some employees are more visible than others. A list of employees, their duties and envelopes are provided in each cabin and in the main lodge for gratuities. If you have any questions, do not be afraid to ask the management for suggestions. If necessary you may charge the gratuities on your credit card. There will be a 5% credit card fee for such transactions.

Need something from town.

Lodge personnel make daily trips into town, and will be more than happy to pick up items that you may need. There are town request slips under the VFH radio in the eating area. Complete the information for your request, place it with some money in a sandwich bag and give it to someone in the kitchen. Bottled water and beer as well as other beverages are available at the lodge.

Reservation and Cancellation Policy

A 50% deposit is required upon making reservations. Reservations will not be guaranteed without a deposit. The balance will be due between April 1 - 15th. All cancellations must be in writing and those received at Island Point Lodge's office before January 1st will be assessed a \$100.00 per person fee and taxes paid to the city of Petersburg. Cancellations made after the February 15th date will be assessed an additional cancellation fee equal to 50% of the total package price (airline reservation cost are not addressed in this fee). Cancellations after April 1st will forfeit their deposit.

IT IS TO YOUR BENEFIT THAT YOU READ ALL THE INFORMATION SENT TO YOU!

Island Point Lodge offers weekly fishing trips beginning on a **Saturday** and ending on the following **Friday** (7 days - 6 nights). The trip includes lodging, meals, boat, rods and reels. The fishing trip is self guided with unlimited hours of Fishing. We will provide you with maps and our personnel will explain with the best information on where the fish have been biting. The lodge is set up for an experienced fisherman with knowledge and experience in operating outboard motors on small crafts. Our crafts are 18 foot Aluminum Alaskan Lunds with outboard motors operated from a side console. The operators must have the knowledge and the ability to read nautical maps (you will get them at the lodge). For your own safety it is best that boats travel in pairs or groups. Should something happen or engine failure, the second boat may be able to provide assistance. If your group has only one boat, introduce yourself to the other guests and ask them if they do not mind that you would like to fish in the same area that they are.

Again, this is a self guided fishing trip and the fishing hours are unlimited, not like those of guided camps where you would go out after breakfast, fish for 5 or six hours and return for dinner. Fishing for some salmon species is done directly in front of the lodge, or on one of two rivers which are only a short five minutes away from the lodge. This allows the fisherman an opportunity to fish from dawn (3 or 4 am) until breakfast, which sometimes are the most productive hours of fishing. Have breakfast and then go out for more salmon or halibut. In addition during the fishing season there are up to ten other rivers within forty five minutes of the lodge which have salmon and trout.

You will have five full days of fishing and possibly some fishing on the day of your arrival (Saturday afternoon). An orientation will take place on Saturday afternoon for first time lodge guests. This will be brief as long as everyone has read all the information sent to them and has signed and returned the appropriate documents to our office, so that they may be processed. **You must return a completed RESERVATION form either by mail, FAX or completing it on our web site and forwarding it to our office.**

The Alaska FISHING LICENSE can be purchased through the mail or use the internet (www.state.ak.us). If you are staying overnight in Petersburg, the hotel's and hardware stores have license applications available. If all of these items are completed before hand, it will allow our staff to proceed with the orientation, get you settled and out fishing on the day you arrive.

Your catch will be packaged and frozen each day. All the fish caught on Thursday will be brought to the walk in freezer that evening to be frozen for your trip home the next day. **ON THURSDAY EVENING WE EXPECT YOU TO RETURN FROM FISHING AROUND 6 PM, JUST BEFORE THE TIME SET FOR DINNER. OUR PERSONNEL MUST CLEAN YOU FISH, HAVE THEM PACKAGED AND THEN IT MUST BE TRANSPORTED TO OUR FREEZER ON THE OTHER SIDE OF WANGELL NARROWS BEHIND PAKKIE'S LANDING. DOING THIS IN THE DARK CAN BE DANGEROUS FOR OUR PERSONNEL. A FREEZER RUN WILL BE DONE JUST BEFORE DARK. IF YOU COME IN TOO LATE WITH YOUR FISH IT MAY NOT GET TO THE -30 FREEZER THAT EVENING AND IT WILL BE PUT IN THE TEMPORARY CHEST FREEZER AT THE LODGE.**
